**John:** If we are to be faithful followers of Christ, we must believe all the Church teaches.



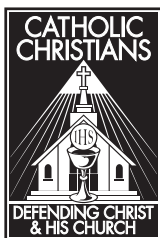
**James:** "The Deposit of Faith is the heritage of faith contained in Sacred Scripture and Tradition, handed on in the Church from the time of the Apostles, from which the Magisterium draws all that it proposes for belief." (CCC)

**John:** The Internet is a useful resource. We must use it cautiously to learn about our world. The Deposit of Faith is an inexhaustible and priceless resource. We must use it faithfully to learn and live our faith.

**James:** Don't use the internet to deepen your understanding of heaven, and hell. Use the Church: the custodian of the Deposit of Faith.

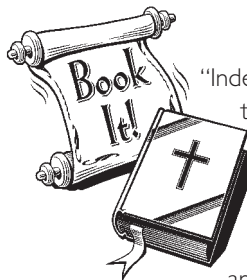

Jesus said to His disciples, "Whoever listens to you listens to me. Whoever rejects you rejects me. And whoever rejects me rejects the One who sent me." Lk 10:16 He then said to the Jews who believed in Him, "If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." The Early Church Father, Saint Vincent of Lerins, a priest and monk wrote on the deposit of faith in 434 A.D. "And so Paul said, 'Guard the deposit.' But, what is the 'deposit?' It is what you must believe, not what you invented; what you received, not what you thought up yourself; it is the outcome of teaching, not the result of ingenuity; what comes from public tradition, not from private plundering. It is something which has come down to you, but which you have not produced; something of which you are not the author but the guardian; not the leader but the one led. 'Guard the deposit', the Apostle says; keep inviolate and spotless the talent of the Catholic faith. What you have believed hold fast to, and pass it on to another." St. Vincent of Lerins (Commoitorium, 22)



"Indeed, the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart." The Deposit of Faith is the Word of God spoken through Holy Tradition, Sacred Scripture, and the Magisterium. A deposit is something

entrusted for safekeeping. In I Timothy, the Apostle Paul tells his disciple Timothy to guard the Deposit of Faith. "O Timothy, guard what has been entrusted to you. Avoid the godless chatter and contradictions of what is falsely called knowledge, for by professing it some have missed the mark as regards the faith." 1 Tim 6:20
